Shirsendu Mukherjee passed away unexpectedly on June 12, 2021, from injuries in his head after a fall. He was a loving dad, a caring husband, a dutiful son, a fun brother, and a very dear friend to many of us. His untimely demise has left a huge void in our hearts.

Shirsendu was born in Nagpur, India on November 19, 1974. He received his BE from Visvesvaraya National Institute of Technology and MS from Rutgers University. He held many senior positions in the financial industry. At the time of his passing, he was the Vice President of Business Analysis and Risk Management at Wells Fargo & Company. He was a leader and the elected President of Samhita Cultural Association of Arizona from January 2020, the position that he had been proudly serving before he departed to his heavenly abode.

He was married to Gargi Mukherjee, and they have 2 daughters Tisha and Aanya. He was an exemplary family man and dearly loved his daughters and wife. The family meant more than anything in the world for him and was always his highest priority.





Setting Aside an Arizona Criminal Conviction

I have learned through being a lawyer, that many people who have a criminal record are good people that made a mistake in the past. Unfortunately, having a criminal record, even a misdemeanor can be hard for many reasons especially when looking for a job.

The good news is Arizona has a way to help with the consequences of a criminal record and many people do not realize that their old criminal conviction might be eligible to be set aside. A set aside is an order from the judge that the criminal charge should be treated as dismissed. The idea is that someone should not face any more penalty after they have successfully served their sentence.

A set aside basically realizes that good people make mistakes who may later turn their life around in a positive direction. For many criminal convictions, including driving under the influence, a set aside application can be submitted once all terms of sentencing and probation have been completed.

Part of the idea behind a set aside is that the person since being found guilty of a crime has been doing well and has followed the law ever since. As a result, a set aside will not help if someone continues to break the law because it can be used against you if you are charged again with a new crime as if you never got a set aside in the first place. However, if you find an old criminal record is still hurting you, getting the conviction set aside may help for purposes of employment, professional licenses, seminars, and schooling.

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
